

Revenue generated from Leagues flows from the Mountain League CTA back into the players' local CTAs and facilities to support tennis in their communities.








#### Print your Scorecards!

  - Ensures all players are registered on the team
- Fill in your players
  - Handwrite on blank scorecard
  - Enter them in Team Management before you print
- Swap scorecards
- Suggestion: Print the entire season and keep in folder in your bag

### Team Management in TennisLink


- Entering Scores
  - Lineup must be published first
  - Players names can be edited
  - Names will be automatically added to the scorecard when you enter scores
  - Opposing team's players are not automatically defaulted onto the scorecard



### When can you re-schedule?





### Captains may mutually agree to re-schedule

- BEFORE the original match date
- Different TIME on original match date

### Reschedule allowed within 2 wks of match date (must be by end of season)

- 1. Inclement Weather
- 2. Facility Issue
- 3. Championship Conflict
- 4. Local Tournament Conflict
- 5. Holiday Conflict







### Majority of Courts Played / Full Team Defaults

In order for a match to be valid, a majority of the courts must be played (3 out of 5 courts or 2 out of 3 courts)

If a team can not field the majority of courts, it is entered as a Full Team Default

ONE Team Default: Standings evaluated - can not benefit either team

TWO Team Defaults: all their matches played will be null and void.

### Playing Lines Early

\_\_\_\_

New Time

- Play on Schedule Matches should be played on the scheduled date/time whenever possible to promote team unity.
- Avoid Full Team Default If a team cannot field enough lines on match day, the minimum number of lines needed to prevent a full team default should be played early.
- Early Play Requires Agreement Playing lines early is allowed, but both captains must agree.
- **Not Poor Sportsmanship** A captain is not obligated to agree to play lines early, and declining is not poor sportsmanship.
- No Expectation of Agreement Captains requesting early play should not assume the opposing captain will agree unless it benefits their team (e.g., providing more players an opportunity to play).
- Confirm in Writing The agreed-upon date and time become the new official match schedule.




### Championship and Local Tournament Conflicts

#### **One-Third of Players Affected**

- Match rescheduling is allowed if at least one-third of the total team roster is participating in or working at an approved event.
- Examples:
  - **15-player roster** → Rescheduling allowed if **5 or more** players are affected.
  - 9-player roster → Rescheduling allowed if 3 or more players are affected.

### Number of Lines That May Be Rescheduled

- The number of rescheduled lines cannot exceed the number of players affected.
- Examples:
  - Singles match (3 lines) → If 3 players are affected, entire match may be rescheduled.
  - Doubles match (3 lines) → If 3 players are affected, up to 2 lines may be rescheduled.



### Championship and Local Tournament Conflicts

League Championships at the following levels:

- North Carolina State
- Southern Section
- National

Western NC USTA Tournament Events

- Asheville Open
- Banana Open
- Apple Open

The team captain **must notify** the opposing captain and LLC **at least 1** week before the scheduled match

### Holiday Conflicts

- Mother's Day
- Father's Day
- Easter
- Memorial Day
- July 4th
- Labor Day

Captains MAY reschedule matches or individual lines under inclement weather makeup rules but are encouraged to play as many lines as they can field.

# Inclement Weather or Darkness

(after the match has begun)



- **Stopping Play** If either captain believes conditions require stopping, play should be halted.
- Waiting Period Players should remain on-site ready to resume for up to 30 minutes, unless it is obvious that court conditions will not improve.
- Resuming Play Matches continue from the exact point, game, and set score when stopped.
- Same Players Players must remain the same for lines where play had started (first service attempt). No substitutions allowed.
- Lineup Adjustments For courts that had not started (still in warm-ups), teams may substitute in players not listed on the original scorecard.

### Make up Matches



Captains can mutually agree to one of the following:

- 1. Set One Make-Up Date: Entire match played on a new date.
- 2. Schedule Individual Courts:
  Captains arrange each line without exchanging player names in advance.

#### NOTE:

- After scorecards are exchanged, new players may only be substituted if they are not on the original scorecard.
- Options may be limited due to Facility policy or court availability
- Captains may choose to assign an acting captain for each line (who may or may not be playing)

### Make-Up Timeframe

Within 14 days of the scheduled match date *or before the season ends*, whichever comes first.


#### What if the make-up is rained out?

- The 14 day clock restarts
- If not played before the season ends, the line is entered as a double default



### Setting the Make-Up Date

- HOME captain coordinates or their designated acting captain(s)
- TWO DATE OPTIONS Home captain should provide at least two date options based on facility availability.
- Four (4) Days Captains MUST reach agreement on a new match date(s) within 4 days
- If no agreement is reached,
  - the match will be set for the **last Friday** in the reschedule window at the original match time.
  - If home courts are unavailable, the local league coordinator will assign a different location.
- Failure to complete the assigned match results in a double default (both teams default the match).



### Re-scheduling Considerations

**RESERVING COURTS** – Captains are responsible

**LINE-UPS -** Giving out line-ups before match time is NOT recommended. Designate acting captains if needed when scheduling lines individually

#### **INDOOR COURTS**

- Cost sharing is encouraged
- at home facility or within 20 min
- within 30 min of match time unless agreed



# 15 Minute Default Rule

- Players must be at the facility and <u>ready to</u> <u>receive the ball</u> within 15 minutes of the match start time or the court being available for the match
- Double check your start times
- Remind your players to arrive early
- If match time is changed by mutual agreement, the 15 minute window starts at the agreed upon time



They're late...now what?



Exchange scorecards and begin play. If the missing player arrives prior to the default time, he/she will take the court assigned and begins. If the missing player arrives after the default time, the default will be entered on the scorecard on a defaultable court.

Wait until the missing player is on site (prior to the 15-minute default time), exchange scorecards and play the match. At the default time, if the player is still not on site and ready to play, the missing player would be moved to a defaultable court, scorecards would then be exchanged, and play would begin. (Note this is not a good option if the reserved court time for a match is limited)

Substitute with an eligible player that is on site and ready to play Substitutions must be made prior to the 15-minute default time and can only be exchanged for the missing player in the original lineup.

### Staggered Matches

(not enough courts for all lines to start together)

#### 5 court matches

- ➤ Lines #1 and #2 singles and Line #1 doubles play first
- > #2 doubles and #3 doubles when courts become available

#### 3 court matches

- ➤ Line #1 doubles and #2 doubles play first
- ➤ line #3 doubles when a court becomes available

ENTIRE team must be present at start unless captains mutually agree to allow secondary lines to arrive 1 hour late

# Advancing to the State Championship



#### **TEAM**

- Flight Winner (or second place if winner declines)
- Playoff Winner
- Direct Advance (1 team flight that automatically qualifies)
- 1 team flight that participates in a qualifying event
- Wild Card Invite

#### **PLAYER Eligibility**

- Minimum required matches (see regulations)
- USTA Membership current



### Local Playoffs





When do we have playoffs?

Multiple flights (such as morning and evening) – winners of the flight play When teams do not play each other the same number of times) –  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  place teams play



Date is set at the beginning of the season

Shortens the season time to complete regular matches – do not get behind on make-ups



Neutral Site (may be moved if both teams prefer and courts are available)



All players must have played the minimum number of matches required to be eligible for the state championship prior to the local championship playoff.

### Regulation Changes for 2025

#### SPRING Adult 40 & Over Maximum Roster - 17 players

- Locally we will continue to play 3 doubles
- State format will be 4 doubles & 1 singles for 3.0, 3.5, 4.0
- Exception: 2.5 & 5.0 levels will play 3 doubles (min 6 players)

40 & Over State Championships will be held in 2 locations

Medical NTRP Appeals will have a \$100 filing fee

### Regulation Changes for 2025

**Rescheduling** – if no agreement is reached – last Friday of the 14 day window

Championship /Tournament Conflicts – rescheduling determined by the number of players affected relative to the team size and number of lines being played

Full team Default – Teams cannot benefit from a Full Team Default

### USTA League Player Promise

- I recognize that tennis is a sport that places the responsibility for fair play on me.
- I promise to abide by the rules of the game, which require me to give the benefit of the doubt to my opponent.
- At all times I shall strive to compete with the true spirit of sportsmanship, recognizing that my behavior on the court is a direct reflection of my character.
- Whether this match ends in my victory or defeat, I promise to conduct myself in a way that honors my opponents, my team, those who support me and the game of tennis.



### Sportsmanship

- Captains set the example
- Applies to players and spectators
- Profanity and equipment abuse are not acceptable even when not directed at another player
- Captains should attempt to deescalate when possible – reminding players this is a RECREATIONAL league
